Committees

Advocacy/PR/Social Media—The committee is responsible for keeping the Coalition engaged and connected with the community by educating the public on Coalition initiatives as well as the activities of its members. The committee raises awareness by issuing promotional materials and media releases, maintaining the website and social media site and engaging in public speaking. The committee is also responsible for keeping the Coalition informed about issues, decisions and opportunities that affect the clients we serve who are struggling with homelessness, poverty and the many variables that surround these issues.

Membership—The committee is responsible to recruit new members to the Coalition to ensure a balanced representation of service providers and others. The committee greets new members and welcomes them to the meetings. The committee is responsible to develop a structure for the Coalition meetings that will encourage greater commitment by the membership to participate in the meetings and activities that will enhance what the Coalition offers to its members and the community. It facilitates the exchange of information and delivery of services by programs within the Continuum of Care.

Service Providers—This committee is responsible for collaborating to strengthen the delivery of services for the homeless in Brown County. The committee strives to coordinate the improvement of services including prevention, shelter, transitional housing, permanent housing and support programs that address the physical needs and enhance the self-sufficiency of the homeless and those at risk of homelessness. The committee helps identify unmet needs and gaps in services.

Systems Committee—This committee designs and implements processes and procedures that affect the day to day work of the Coalition. The committee gathers information from HUD, from the State COC, from the local coalition and the community to identify gaps in services and ways to meet those gaps.
