


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CRISIS FLOW CHART CONT. POSSIBLE OUTCOMES

Immediate Safety	Non-Immediate	No Safety
Concern	Safety Concern	Concerns
Option 1: Voluntary inpatient treatment at any accessible facility. Average stay is 3-5 days. Cannot discharge without approval. Option 2: Involuntary inpatient hospitalization to Bellin Psych, Willow Creek, Nicolet Psychiatric Center, or Winnebago. Can be less than 72 hours.	Option 1: Safety plan agreement where individual returns to community with additional supports, referrals to outpatient services and follow up calls from Crisis Center for 24-48 hours. Option 2: Voluntary crisis stabilization placement at BayHaven. Adults only. Average stay is 3-5 days. Option 3: Voluntary inpatient hospitalization	Option 1: Referral to outpatient services. Option 2: Follow up calls from Crisis Center Option 3: Referral to voluntary county case management. Option 4: Voluntary Crisis Stabilization. Adults only.
